
Civil War in America



Our Civil War collection includes... Reproductions of the Lincoln Bible, a cypher, newspapers, exclusive regiment coasters, and postcards.



Named New National Ambassador for Young People's Literature 2014-2015



The National Ambassador for Young People's Literature is named by the Librarian of Congress for a two-year term, based on recommendations from a selection committee representing many segments of the book community. The selection criteria include the candidate's contribution to young people's literature and the ability to relate to children. The position was created to raise national awareness of the importance of young people's literature as it relates to lifelong literacy, education and the development and betterment of the lives of young people.

Kate DiCamillo has prestigious awards such as winner of the Newbery Medal and a Newbery Honor, a National Book Award Finalist, and a Boston Globe–Horn Book Award Winner.

She has accomplished 12 New York Times best-selling titles and sold over 20.5 million copies of her books. DiCamillo has had two major feature-film adaptations of her books: *Because of Winn-Dixie* and *The Tale of Despereaux*.
